OYSTERMOUTH PRIMARY SCHOOL FAIRTRADE POLICY

Ostermouth Primary School is committed to supporting Fairtrade wherever possible.

Fairtrade is about guaranteeing a better deal for third world producers.

In particular the school will:

- ✓ Support the Fairtrade Steering Group.
- ✓ Ensure Fairtrade is part of the School Development Plan.
- ✓ Use Fairtrade products wherever possible:
 - tea, coffee, sugar and biscuits in the staff room and at meetings
 - in cookery activities
 - in the canteen
 - in the Tuck Shop
- ✓ Offer parents the choice of buying school uniform made from Fairtrade cotton.
- ✓ Ensure Fairtrade products are available wherever possible. For example, at events in the school or the community

- ✓ Ask the LEA to include the use of Fairtrade products as a requirement in catering contracts for schools.
- ✓ Ensure learning about Fairtrade happens in a range of lessons and in whole school activities.
- ✓ Promote Fairtrade within the school and wider community, particularly during Fairtrade Fortnight.
- ✓ Do something extra each year to promote Fairtrade.
