Year 4 Autumn Term 2020



We have made posters explaining about our chosen human body organ. We were lucky enough to interview an orthopaedic surgeon on Teams (thank you Rhys) and had a lifesized skeleton in the room with us for a few weeks called Edna, to help us learn about bones. Recently we have studied the poem "Coming Home" by Michael Morpurgo and are writing our own odes to Christmas. In Numeracy we are currently learning to write the time, having learned all about the calendar and the seasons and are trying to be the fastest times tables experts in the School! We have studied cubism like Picasso and sculpture like Antony Gormley. We had a moving Remembrance Week where we learned about some aspects of war, made collage poppies and composed our own "Last Post" on the glockenspiel. Despite everything, we have tried to, "Work hard, play hard and do the right thing," which is our Class Motto. We are all looking forward to a having a healthy and happy Christmas.

Year 4, Mrs. F, Ms. Stocks, Ms Seacombe and Ms. Williams were determined to have "Healthy Minds and Bodies" this term, by taking on the new and improved Oystermouth School Garden! We did some EPIC planning and devised a weekly job rota. This included weighing birdseed and filling up feeders, cleaning the birdbaths, brushing weeding and planting. We also learnt to spell in the garden and made some wonderful clay figures. We had to work cooperatively when Sara Holden gave us an art workshop, weaving obelisks on which we can grow climbing plants, from sustainable willow. We learn in a multisensory way when we are outside- writing clock times in chalk or measuring perimeters with specially cut sticks. We think it makes learning fun. We have many plans for the Spring and Summer and have already planted some daffodil bulbs and beans!

As well as learning outside, we measured a running track and run/walk around it ten times to complete a kilometre a day. All the Y4 staff do it too!

We have started to use BBC Microbits to learn how to code. We have made name badges and fortune tellers. Our next job is to make electronic Christmas cards.














SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENTS Tommy Daniels Y3








SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENTS Samuel Harris Y4
