What's in our square mile?

AUTUMN TERM IN YEAR 1

What's in our square mile?

Well I can safely say that it has been a busy term in Year 1. as well as lots of literacy and numeracy we have been able to get out and explore our local area. We started by looking at the different houses that we could find in Mumbles, then we had a great morning at the castle, taking photographs and enjoying the sunshine. On the beach we collected all types of natural materials and put on an impromptu exhibition as well as building a giant spiral in the style of Andy Goldsworthy. We walked along the promenade, comparing the path today with what it used to look like. We looked high and low and found lots of evidence of the old tram line still in place. Lastly we went to the woods to explore using our senses.





Last month we had a Nanobot race day. The class split into teams and each team planned and made a part of a racetrack that covered the whole classroom. Each team had a nanobot which they named and then we had a big race. The bots had to go over the Plasticine track, through the Lego tunnel, over the lava field, through the cardboard maze, then negotiate the tunnel of trees before entering the cave of rotating knives. It was very exciting and we had to make some adjustments to the track along the way. The bots were really good at escaping and scuttling off on their own but we managed to keep herding them back to the track. What a fantastic day!

To celebrate Bonfire Night we used our thinking skills and team work to find out the story behind the celebration. We researched lots of information about Guy Fawkes and then worked in ways of our own choosing to show what we had learned. I was so impressed by the children's creativity which ranged from models of the Houses of Parliament and the Tower of London, to stories, pictures and books.















AUTUMN TERM IN YEAR 2

The children have settled in to year 2 amazingly. They are such a hard working, enthusiastic class and have immersed themselves in their learning throughout the term, da iawn pawb!

The children really enjoyed looking deeper at our locality. They have discussed green spaces, looked at the different styles of houses and buildings and thought about what makes a community. The children loved their locality walk, which enabled them to write a great recount of their journey and create some amazing art-work of the castle. AUTUMN TERM IN YEAR 3

We are concluding our last term with Miss Thomas by looking at traditional Christmas stories from around the world and having lots of fun. AUTUMN TERM IN YEAR 4

The Year 4 class have worked really hard this term! Our topic 'What's in Our Square Mile?' Got us out and about in the local area. We had a brilliant tour of Oystermouth castle which we linked to our work on medieval history. In literacy we wrote a discussion piece about whether it would be better to live in the middle ages or today. We went to visit Mumbles sea hive, meeting a scientist from the University who talked about the effect of climate change and the project to build a more welcoming habitat for sea life along our local coast line. We loved rockpooling and got very muddy in Grannie's Custard! It was a great day.



During our work on celebrations, we looked at how different countries enjoy Christmas and based our information writing on that. We loved learning about Diwali and Hannukah and making natural Christmas crafts from the things we foraged on our walk to the castle woods.



Parking

Breakfast Club and After School Club

Breakfast Club can only accept children at 8:00am (no later) from the Castle Road entrance. You do not need to book for the Breakfast Club. We provide toast, water and milk. There is a charge of £1 per pupil, per session that must be paid at the start of the week or on arrival. Please can you put the payment in an envelope with your child's name on it.

You need to book your child/ren in to After School Club. You will receive a text every Tuesday with a link to the After School Club Booking Form. Weather permitting the children will play outside but will brought inside school when the evenings get colder. After School Club pick up times are 4:00pm, 4:30pm, 5:00pm and 5:30pm. A member of staff will bring the children to the entrance on Castle Road (not Newton Road).

Please provide a healthy snack for your child/ren if they are attending After School Club. You can contact a member of the After School Club staff on 07395115787. Please do not use this number during the school day.

Foodbank
