I know you did some work on o'clock with Miss Draper in Reception so this activity is a revision session. I have sent you a video introducing this activity. Remember, the big hand pointing to the 12 means o'clock and the little hand points to the hour.

I will post a video to tell you the answers later in the week. 2 Dinosaur Discovery In Dinosaur Discovery you can meet lots of dinosaurs including T Rex, Stegosaurus, Triceratops, Diplodocus and Yi. You'll need to use your science skills to collect all the dinosaur stickers and become a dinoexpert! While you are playing this game you will be 'working scientifically' - that means thinking like a scientist! A scientist who studies Dinosaurs is called a Palaeontologist. Would a T Rex catch a Triceratops? What did a Stegosaurus eat? Where did the Yi find its food? How do we know what dinosaurs looked like? Draw and label your dinosaur. Give it an interesting name as well.


