4	<p>WALT: Collect information to complete a table and bar chart. I have loved finding out about Penguins over the last few weeks.</p> <p>Last week was Penguin Awareness Day so I thought we could do some research about penguins and improve our Maths at the same time.</p> <p>I have attached a picture of the different types of penguin on teams.</p> <p>I would like you to find out how much at least six types of penguins weigh and then go onto J2E to create a table and bar chart to show the information.</p> <p>The easiest way to find out the answers is by simply asking google 'How much do _____ penguins weigh?' If the answer gives more than one numbers such as 2kg - 4kg then use the highest number.</p> <p>I have added a video on teams to show you how to complete this activity</p>	
5	<p>My Maths</p> <p>This week I have set you some My Maths challenges about 2d and 3d shapes. We covered this before half term so it will be a good chance to see how much you have remembered.</p> <p>Clue - an oblong is another name for a rectangle.</p> <p>Watch the lessons first and then complete the online homework activities. Once you have finished I will know and can see how clever you are.</p> <p>If you have any problems setting this up please let me know.</p>
