	Maths Activities	Completed
1	<p>WALT: Use ordinal numbers to 20 in practical situations</p> <p>This week we are going to learn about ordinal numbers which are numbers that define the position or order in a series, such as first, second, third etc</p> <p>Click on the link for an introduction to ordinal numbers https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/zhw8d6f</p> <p>Listen to me read the story of Chinese New Year. Then I would like you to order the animals from 1st to 12th based on their position in the race.</p> <p>1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th</p> <p>If you are able to print the animal pictures, you could cut them out, place them in order and make badges or medals to show where they finished in the race.</p> <p>If you are not able to print the animal pictures, you could make badges or medals, stick them in your homework book and either write the animals name or draw pictures next to it.</p>	
2	<p>WALT: Make whole turns and half turns</p> <p>Today we are going to be learning about whole and half turns.</p> <p>I have added a video in teams to introduce this activity. There is also a true or false problem for you to think about and a worksheet to complete.</p> <p>Don't worry if you can't print the worksheet out, you can also do this by asking the children to make the turns or by using objects.</p>	

3	<p>WALT: Recall one more and one less of a number</p> <p>Right at the start of Year 1, way back in September, we worked on finding one more and one less. Today we are going to practise this skill and try to extend it a bit further.</p> <p>I have attached three true or false problems and three worksheets on teams for you to try.</p> <p>Cold: One more and one less to 20 Warm: One more and one less to 50 Hot: One more and one less to 100</p> <p>You only have to try one of the challenges.</p> <p>Once you have finished the worksheet, try the interactive game https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/chopper-squad</p> <p>Cold: Up to 20 Warm: Up to 50 Hot: Up to 100</p> <p>Don't worry if you are not able to print the worksheets out. You can just record the answers in your homework book instead.</p>	
4	<p>WALT: Recognise and create a symmetrical picture or shape.</p> <p>Before Christmas we started working on symmetry. Symmetry is when both sides of a shape, picture or letter are exactly the same.</p> <p>Symmetry matching is a game we have already played in class this year.</p> <p>https://www.topmarks.co.uk/symmetry/symmetry-matching</p> <p>Cold: Play symmetry matching pictures. Warm: Play symmetry matching shapes. Hot: Play symmetry matching patterns</p> <p>Send me a picture of your final score so I can see how you have got on. Can you got to 50 overall? You could try all three activities if you want.</p>	

5	<p style="text-align: center;">My Maths</p> <p>This week I have set you some My Maths challenges on measuring.</p> <p>Watch the lessons first and then complete the online homework activities. Once you have finished I will know and can see how clever you are.</p> <p>If you have any problems setting this up please let me know.</p>

1	<p>WALT: Read a range of texts with confidence</p> <p>It is so important for the children to keep reading as much as they can during the time we are not in school.</p> <p>Use this link to find some brilliant eBooks https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk I know lots of you are already doing this and having great fun too. You will need to set up a free account on Oxford Owl if you would like to use it. There are a range of great books available .</p> <p>Please record any books read in the Reading diary.</p>	
2	<p>WALT: Write an exploration story</p> <p>This week I want you to write your exploration stories.</p> <p>Use your storyboard from last week and try to extend it as much as you can, using describing words, similes and more details.</p> <p>I will send you all some notes on class dojo of how I would like you to extend your work from the storyboard you made last week.</p>	
3	<p>WALT: Spell words using common digraphs</p> <p>This week, we are going to do some revision of the sounds we have been learning over the last few weeks.</p> <p>Mrs Franklin's group - ai, ee, ng</p> <p>Mrs Harris' group - ar, or, ur, ow</p> <p>Mr Lloyd-Jones' group - ur, ow, oi, ear, air</p> <p>I would like you to try to think of at least three words for each of the sounds you have been working on and then complete the worksheet by filling in the gaps in the sentences.</p> <p>Don't worry if you are unable to print out the worksheets, you can just write the sentences in your homework book.</p>

4	<p>WALT: Recall details from information texts Listen to me reading the story of Chinese New Year.</p> <p>Once you have finished, answer these questions.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Which animal won the race? 2) Which animal came last in the race? 3) How did the rabbit get across to the other side? 4) Which animal shocked the horse? 5) Which animals worked together as a team? 6) How do you think the cat felt at the end of the race? <p>I was born in 1983, which means I was born in the year of the pig. Mrs Harris was born in 1972, which means she was born in the year of the rat. Mrs Franklin was born in 1971, which means she was born in the year of the dog.</p> <p>You were all born in either 2014 or 2015, which means you were either born in the year of the horse or the year of the goat.</p> <p>Find out what year your Mum and Dad and brothers and sisters were born in and work out which animal they are. You can do this by asking google - 2014 Chinese New Year.</p>

3	<p style="text-align: center;">China</p> <p>Our final exploration is going to take us to China.</p> <p>Find out some facts about China.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) What is the capital city? 2) How many people live there? 3) What animals come from China? 4) Where is China on a map? Which countries are next to it? 5) Who is the leader of China? 6) What does the flag look like? 	
4	<p style="text-align: center;">Chinese New Year</p> <p>Every year the people of China celebrate Chinese New Year. Chinese New Year 2021 falls on Friday, February 12th, 2021.
