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

Tuesday	Revision of multiples I know some of you were finding the fractions work before half term slightly difficult. To perform questions that ask us to compare fractions with different denominators, we need to remember the work we have done on multiples. Can you have a go at the revision activity in Teams?

Tuesday	<p>Fairtrade reading comprehension</p> <p>This week it is 'Fairtrade Fortnight'. Can you read the information sheet all about Fairtrade and answer the accompanying questions? Please remember to answer in full sentences and to check your spelling and punctuation.</p>	
Wednesday	<p>For the next few weeks, our Literacy topic is going to be 'Information Writing'.</p> <p>Can you think of all the different forms of writing where we are given information?</p> <p>This week we are going to look at writing non-chronological reports. A non-chronological report is a text which isn't written in time order. They are normally non-fiction texts which give information on a particular subject or event, without referring to the order in which things happen.</p> <p>Can you watch the PowerPoint and complete the activity? They are located in the Literacy folder in Teams.</p>	
Thursday	<p>Spelling and Grammar</p> <p>Can you complete the connectives activity in the Literacy folder in Teams? You will need to re-write the sentences, making sure you join each pair of the simple sentences together in order to make a complex sentence. Make sure you check your punctuation!</p> <p>Weekly spelling is also located in the Literacy file in Teams.</p>	
Friday	<p style="text-align: center;">Weekly Welsh</p> <p>Bore da pawb! Weekly Welsh is happening right across our school. You can find this week's sheet by clicking on the link below or going to the Welsh Language page on our Website.</p> <p>This week's pattern links to our work on Fairtrade or Masnach Deg and asks Ga i.....? Can I have..... ?</p> <p>Take your time to watch the film clips before you practice the patterns and make sure that you can remember some of the vocabulary.</p> <p>Practice the patterns with your family or perhaps you could set up your own Fairtrade shop and ask Ga i.....? You can listen to the story, and then perhaps mute the sound and have a go at reading one or two of the phrases yourself. The story this week is all about some friends going out to tea in their local pizzeria. 1	<p>Cocoa Climate</p> <p>Firstly, I would like you to look at this photo by scanning the QR code below.</p>  <p>What type of farmer do you think this is? What is growing on this farmer's farm? Where in the world is this? What do you think the temperature is like in this photograph?</p> <p>Next, I would like you to watch this short video.</p> <p>https://vimeo.com/503505343</p> <p>Once you have watched the video, think about - what are the differences between these two climates? What are the similarities? Can you use the Cocoa Climate worksheet in Teams to record these similarities and differences? Don't forget to record the types of agriculture in these two climates.</p>	
2	<p>Use Google Maps or an atlas to travel around the world! Can you find a country where cocoa grows? Check the temperature in that country today. What was the temperature in that country 50 years ago? Has it changed? What does this tell you?</p> <p>I would like you to undertake some Independent research on climate change. How are temperate climates affected by the climate crisis? How are tropical rainforest climates affected by the climate crisis? How are the people in those environments affected?</p> <p>Can you create a PowerPoint packed full of information?</p>	

3	<p>Our topic for the next few weeks will be- 'What makes Wales wonderful?'</p> <p>We are very fortunate to live in such a fantastic location - we have spectacular beaches, an abundance of mountains, green spaces and nature reserves and many other features that make our country so special. What makes you proud to live in Wales and what do you think makes our country so wonderful? As part of our EPIC planning, I want you to think about the above question and when you have decided on an aspect of Wales that you think is wonderful, compile a list of questions and facts that you would like the answers to.
